glorify His name.

To praise is to exalt, to magnify, to glorify, and to declare the goodness and the greatness of something or someone. Praise should be as natural for the believer as eating, breathing, or drinking. We are told to praise God "in," "for," and "with" all that we are. In other words, we are told where, why, and how to praise Him.

The writer of Hebrews begins this verse with "through Him." This is where all true praise begins. The concept of "through Him" or "in Him" or "by Him" is a common theme in the Bible. We are told that "in Him" we have been blessed, chosen, adopted, forgiven, born-again, and secured. And, "through Him" we have been raised, redeemed, and reconciled to God. And it is *through Him* that we offer our "spiritual sacrifices" to God.

Remember the words of Jesus when the Scribes and Pharisees tried to stop the praise of the people during the triumphant entry? **Luke 19:40 (KJV)**

⁴⁰ And he answered and said unto them, I tell you that, if these should hold their peace, the stones would immediately cry out.

How much of this the crowd really understood what was going on, I cannot tell. But they responded by quoting their praises from a messianic psalm (Ps. 118:25-26). Praise is contagious. You see, praise causes things like standing, singing, shouting, clapping hands, raising hands, dancing, playing instruments, and even testifying. All of these are done for glory to the object of their praise.

Praise always has an outcome. What's the outcome of our Praise? What does praising God do? In a word, praise can transform your life. It transforms depression into expectation, darkness to light, sorrow to joy, and even hopelessness into anticipation. There is power in your praise. Praise has the ability to change your life.

"The Power of Praise"

¹ Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands.

² Serve the LORD with gladness: come before his presence with singing.

³ Know ye that the LORD he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

⁴ Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name.

⁵ For the LORD is good; his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth to all generations.

The psalm also admonishes us not to *forget* the blessings of the Lord. It is the business of the church to praise the Lord. Have a great new year praising the Lord!!!

NEW YEARS TRADITIONS

TRADITIONAL SOUTHERN NEW YEAR'S DAY MENU

Of all the events we celebrate in the South, the menu for a traditional Southern New Year's Day probably carries the most tradition. Each component has a special meaning. We wouldn't think of letting New Year's Day get past us without enjoying this traditional meal. The foods represent progress, blessings, money and gold.

PROGRESS - A pig roots forward. A chicken scratches backwards. A cow stands still. Pork symbolizes forward progress. Ham, neckbones, pork chops, pork roast, pork pot, chitterlings, etc. They can also represent the bounty of the land.

BLESSINGS - The Southern tradition of blackeye peas symbolizes blessings. Cook them with ham hocks, salt pork or hog jowls. Grains represent abundance because they swell when cooked, so Southerners add rice for Hoppin' John. One legend originates in Louisiana, from the French Creole word for pigeon peas. Others tie it to the Carolinas, with African and French roots. Either way, culinary historians can trace the dish as far back as the early 1800s. Some believe that you need to eat 365 peas - to represent 365 days of the year.

MONEY OR WEALTH - Collards, turnip greens and kale are popular in America, symbolic for paper money or wealth. They are usually cooked with some kind of smoked meat. The Germans like their sauerkraut. The Danish eat their kale with cinnamon and sugar.

GOLD - Cornbread cooked in little medallion shaped pieces represents gold. The peas themselves, as a round food, also represent coins. Round, green lentils are traditional in many different cultures, for prosperity. Italians, for example, have a dish called cotechino con lenticchie, sausage and green lentils, eaten just after midnight. Germans and Brazilians also eat lentil dishes. Round cakes are a tradition in some cultures.

No doubt there are some dishes you cannot start the new year without, and the history behind those family new year traditions is fascinating:

Grapes: Eating 12 grapes for each chime of the clock at midnight has Spanish origins. Grape growers allegedly began the tradition as a way to get rid of a surplus of grapes. In addition to each chime of the clock, each grape also represents a month of the year. If you get a grape that is sour, it may mean that month will be a rough one.

Most fish are OK, though some traditions caution against eating bottom dwelling fish because they can hold you down. The Japanese also eat shrimp for long life. Cakes and sweets for New Year's can be found all over the world.

Brother Hill Honored

One of the standards of a Sunday service is hearing the choirs and/or soloists singing songs of Zion at Mt. Bethel. We have been blessed to have one of the best in the city of Jacksonville as the Minister of Music, and his name is Brother Ricky Hill. On third Sunday, the Music and Arts Ministry honored him for his dedication and service throughout the year. Brother Hill is normally here at the church four to six days a week practicing with and playing for the S. A. Thomas Choir, the R. E. Herring Male Chorus, the Mt. Bethel Praise Team, and the Youth Choir. Brother Hill became a part of the Music Staff in 1996 and was appointed as the Minister of Music from 1997-2009, returning in 2014 and again being appointed Minister of Music in January 2015.



He has been into music for the majority of his life. He took lessons starting at the age of eight taught by Mother Helen Bellamy, and began playing for his first church at the age of 13. Besides Mother Bellamy, Brother Hill has studied music under Mr. Verdell Jakes, Mr. Willie Ross, and then took his skills to Florida Agriculture and Mechanical University. Brother Hill was greatly influenced by his father, Richard Hill, Jr., who opened his horizon to all types of music. He mastered his craft by teaching himself to play by ear.

Brother Hill organized the "H.I.S. (Hallelujah, I'm Saved) Community Choir" at the age of 20 along with other groups such as H.I.S. Men, H.I.S. Ladies, Covered in Jesus' Name and UNITY. He wrote and produced music for plays such as "I Am My Brother's Keeper," written by his cousin, Sandra McCoy. He has traveled all over the country playing for a number of today's famous recording artists that you hear regularly by way of radio and other media. He has taught and been a mentor to a great number of local and national musicians who still contact him to this day. Brother Hill also produced his own CD, "Music 4 the Soul," released in December 2005.

The Music and Arts Ministry, along with the Mount Bethel family, just wants to say "Thank You" to Brother Richard Hill III for the hard work, commitment, and dedication to the craft that he has perfected over the years to the glory of God. "To be used of God is his desire."
