#### "Minister One to Another"

1 Peter 4:10 (KJV) As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

The key relationship in the work place must be the relationship between the employer and the employee. You see, when an employer hires a new employee, he is not just bringing a new member of the workforce aboard, he is also starting a new

relationship. And managing this relationship is vital to business success. When the employer develops a strong relationship with his employee it can lead to greater employee happiness and increased productivity.

Listen, when you work for God - you work for the best; He is the best employer ever! It is a wonderful thing to see when someone gives their heart to Jesus. This great journey begins: the journey of love and service to Him. Brothers and sisters, this is what it means to be a Christian. You are a servant of God, a servant of Jesus Christ, a servant of the gospel, to share the message of forgiveness and eternal life through faith in Christ. You are a servant of the church, and of other believers.

The great thing about our employer (God) is, He never gives us a job that He has not gifted us to do. James 1:17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning. There is no doubt as to the fact that God has given us gifts.

These gifts are called (GK) charismata. In the New Testament, a charisma is something given to man by God which the man himself could not have acquired or attained. Charismata it is not a natural talent. It is given to the believer so that he can fulfill his task on earth.

Listen, a man or a woman might practice for a lifetime and never become a virtuoso in the particular arts like music, singing or playing a musical instrument. A virtuoso has more than practice; he or she has something plus, the charisma which is a gift of God. A man might toil for a lifetime and still not be skilled in the use of tools of carving wood and shaping metals. The man that is gifted has something plus, the charisma which is a gift of God.

One might practice speaking forever and a day, learn all the catch phrases and *(Continued from Page 1)* humorous stories, and still never acquire that anointing which moves an audience or a congregation to follow the Lord. This person has something plus, that charisma which is a gift of God. Every person has his own charisma. It is that something plus given him by God.

We are called to serve each other in the body of Christ. God has assigned to us gifts to work with and the opportunity to use them according to our abilities. Listen, you and I have a gift and it is because God gave it to us. And He expects us to manage His gifts within the boundaries of our ability.

1 Peter 4:10 (KJV): As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

Every Christian has at least one spiritual gift that he must use to the glory of God and the building up of the church (see Rom. 12:1-13; 1 Cor. 12; Eph. 4:1-16). We are stewards. God has entrusted these gifts to us that we might use them for the good of His church. He even gives us the spiritual ability to develop our gifts and be faithful servants of the church.

The gifts that we have came because of God's grace. They must be accepted and exercised by faith. We were saved "by grace, through faith" (Eph. 2:8-9), and we must live and serve "by grace through faith." Since our gifts are from God, we cannot take the credit for them. Remember God gets the glory.




Grace is a beautiful word, truly a great Bible truth is resonating in this word. In fact, it is a word and concept without which man's salvation would be impossible. The New Testament writers used *charis*, pre-eminently of that kindness by which God bestows favors even upon the ill-deserving, grants to sinners the pardon of their offences, and bids them accept of eternal salvation through Christ.

When we speak of God's grace, we mean all the good gifts we enjoy freely in life, and there are so many. We could spend a lifetime celebrating them. Grace is waking up each morning, living with your affliction, having a place to live, food to eat and maybe even a job. But it's greater than that, it's having that personal relationship with the lord and sharing with Him everything, surrendering your life completely.

"Grace" speaks of the generous love of God in His gift of the Savior. Those "under grace" have accepted "as a gift" the forgiveness and rescue made and offered in Christ. No longer do they seek to "earn" God's approval by an upright life and acts of service. The life "under grace" is thus a life of gratitude and love. These become the governing principles as we "work out" the implications of what God "works in" us (Phil. 2.12,13).

So, while we cannot gain God's favor on our own merits, we can never repay His generosity either! However, this does not mean that we "take it easy." We should no longer be seeking to match the minimum requirements of God's Law. If we are living under grace, we will want to give our maximum for the One who has given His maximum for us! This applies to every area of our lives.
