PASTOR'S MESSAGE



It's Thanksgiving!

There was a fourth-grade boy who was asked to give a report on Thanksgiving, and to read it to the entire class. The teacher reminded him that he needed to be politically correct. "Remember, there are certain things that you are not allowed to say in public school because it might offend others."

On the day of the report the boy stood and read, "The Pilgrims came here from England seeking freedom of you know what. When they got here they gave thanks to you know who. And because of them, we can worship each Sunday at you know where."

On the fourth Thursday of this month, we celebrate Thanksgiving. Brothers and sisters, there is something just marvelous about Thanksgiving. It can be defined as a time when congregations and families reflect upon the works that

God has done in the past, while anticipating His continued blessing and favor in the future.

Reflection on Fall

It is interesting to discover what causes the beautiful colors of fall in the eastern deciduous forests, and to realize it may be an analogy of what happens to all of us sooner or later in our lives. The color changes are caused by a very complex bio-chemical process, but it can be summarized very simply. The chlorophyll pigment that produces the brilliant greens of summer breaks down as the days grow shorter and colder. The pigments of yellow, orange and red that are masked by the green can then begin to show through. It is not a new color. The color has always been there, but only now, when the tree or shrub can no longer mask it with chlorophyll does it become visible.

Something of this same kind of thing can happen in a human life. When we no longer need to hide behind our masks, when we discover who we are as children of a loving and faithful God, we can allow our true selves to emerge. The analogy works in another way also. When we are no longer able to mask our true selves (this usual- ly happens as we grow older), the truth of what we have made of our lives begins to emerge. It is often true that we do not change as we grow older, we simply become more intensely what we have grown to be. One whose personality has been angry or domineering or unfriendly usually will become more so with aging. Those are truths worth pondering and learning from.

Watching the leaves turn can offer us valuable lessons about ourselves. But certainly the most important lessons from the natural world have to do with the One who is Lord of all nature. The beauty of fall is a reflection of the beauty of the Creator. And the process that leads from summer to fall and then to the death of wintertime is a reminder of our own mortality. But that is never the end. Spring comes again. God has promised us the gift of new life and springtime is its herald. Our task is simply to live out the seasons of our lives as fully as we can, and in so doing , to experience the deep joy and beauty that God offers us all. When that happens, the image of God in each of us emerges.





In BRAM, members will be able to view important church history, documents, pictures, etc. They will also be able to check out biblical resource materials (books, cds, dvds, etc.).


Computer access is also available to histories, documents and pictures.

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 an armistice between Germany and the Allied Nations came into effect. On November 11, 1919, Armistice Day was commemorated for the first time.

The day should be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory.

On June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor all American veterans, wherever and whenever they had served. Veterans Day is generally regarded today as honoring all those who ever *served* in the U.S. Armed Force rather than only those who actually *fought* in a war.

Bethel was represented with ten walkers and several volunteers. Starting at A. The next stop was the First Coast News Station next to the stadium where we prayed for the educational system, led by Ministers Houston. Next was the down- town Duval County jail where we prayed for the incarcerated and for the leaders of this nation. Our last stop was the Sulzbacher Center where Mt. Bethel prayed with the citizens who were sitting along the street and another group of walkers prayed with folks who were around the corner. Sis. Patricia Scott brought along a huge first aid kit bag to assist any walkers who may have needed attention along the route. Dea. John Scott followed the route in his vehicle to assist any walkers who were not able to finish. He also utilized his DJI Phantom 4 drone to take aerial photos and videos at each of the stops.

Data: 215 participants at the prayer walk; 34 Volunteers w/ Free GBIMC volunteer shirt; 75 families in the Eastside area blessed with FREE groceries; 100 GBIMC shirts donated to the Youth. All in all, a great spiritual unity was felt by all that participated, and a spe- cial thank you to the Houstons and all the supporters. They will keep us abreast of information concerning next year's walk to be held on October 20, 2018.
