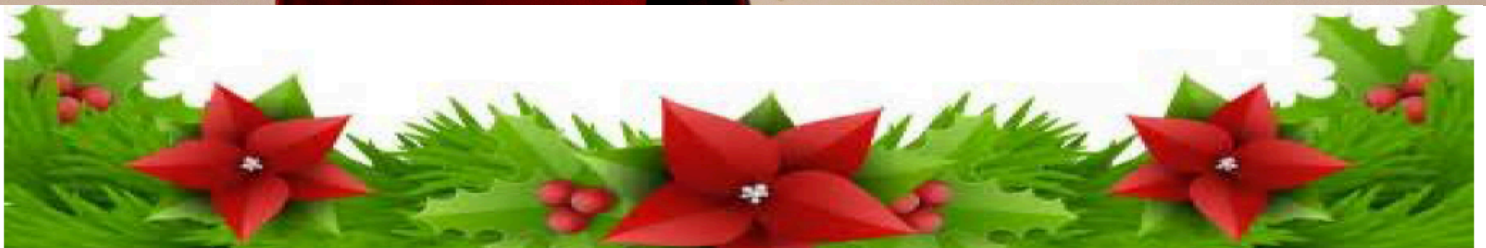

PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Merry Christmas:

Christmas is an event planned by God; in fact, God orchestrates all of the sequence of events that makes the Christmas story. It was at the right time; it was the right season. God sent His only begotten Son into the world. *Galatians 4: 4-5 But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, (5) To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.*

You see, God so arranged things here on the earth and in our lives to operate in times and seasons. Listen, God by his providence governs the world, and He has pre-determined particular things in our lives and events in our lives to take place at particular times.

And yet, my brothers and sisters, God is in control of time, but God is not controlled by time. God always moves on time. He sent His only begotten Son into the world and He came at the fullness of time.

Christmas is not only about time and season, but it's about giving the right gift. This Christmas season two things are important to me, two things top my list: First, finding that right gift for the right person; and secondly, making sure it's at the right price. You see my gift will convey my message.

I remember my first Christmas after getting married; I was so excited about purchasing my first Christmas gift for my wife. I was young in marriage, and in the military. I went to the base commissary, searching for the right gift. I purchased an electric can opener. Man, I was so excited. I remember wrapping it and placing it under the tree. On that Christmas morning, I got it from under the tree and gave it to her. Well, after that Christmas day, I learned the difference between buying a gift for the house and buying a gift for your wife. Your Christmas Gifts convey messages.

Secondly, the gift must be the right price. Listen, the most expensive gift may not necessarily be the right gift. But it is the feeling behind the gift that is priceless. It may not measure up to the material expectations of our modern mind, but the love that it bears is incomparable.

Will your gift be the right gift or the right price? Well, this year, just like every year, millions of people, both children and adults, will open millions of gifts. Some of the clothes will fit and some won't fit. Some will be the right color, and some will be the wrong color. Some gifts will be kept, and some will be returned or exchanged.

But there is one gift that meets everyone's need, one gift that will never wear out, one gift that will never break or need repairing. This gift that is appropriate for a small child, or a teenager, or an adult, or a senior adult. This gift is right for a boy or girl, man or woman, it makes no difference. The gift we all need, the most valuable gift of all is the gift of Jesus. He is what Christmas is all about.

John 3:16 (KJV) For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

When you give a special gift to someone you love, you want the gift and timing to be just right. I mean, you don't give an engagement ring to your girlfriend while eating french fries at McDonalds, or during half time at a ballgame. When you give your gift, you try to orchestrate things so that everything is right.

Listen, the whole world has been bitten by sin, and "the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23). God sent His Son to die for the whole world. The difference between perishing and living, between condemnation and salvation, is faith in Jesus Christ; this is the gift of Christmas.

Honoring Our Heroes

In 1776 when the United States was first formed, government officials thought of ways to protect this great land so different branches of the military were formed. The Army, Navy, and the Marine Corp were founded in 1775; the US Coast Guard was founded in 1790 and the Air Force in 1947. Throughout the years, many people have fought to defend this great nation against both foreign and domestic threats. At the first anniversary of the end of World War I, "Armistice Day" was celebrated on November 11, 1919. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 to make it an annual celebration, and in 1938, Veterans Day became a national holiday.

On Sunday, November 12th, Mt. Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, facilitated by Dea. Anthony Davis, honored all members that served in the military. Dea. Davis opened with a prayer followed by a powerful rendition of the national anthem sung by Sis. Sherrica Frazier. Sis. Jacole Davis read all the names of the members who have served: 36 members have transitioned to glory; 54 veterans are still living; and 9 members are currently on active duty status.

Deacon Davis then closed out the ceremony by inviting all the military members over to the Family Life Center for tokens of appreciation and read a poem of "Thank you to all Military members." Today when you see a "retired" or "active" member of the armed forces, say "Thank you," give a simple nod of the head, or lightly touch your heart and let them know how grateful you are for their service. On behalf of all of us we would like to say "Thank You" to every soldier for your dedication and hard work in protecting the United States of America; a special thank you to Pastor Herring for allowing this ceremony to take place; and to Deacon Davis and his committee for leading the ceremony.

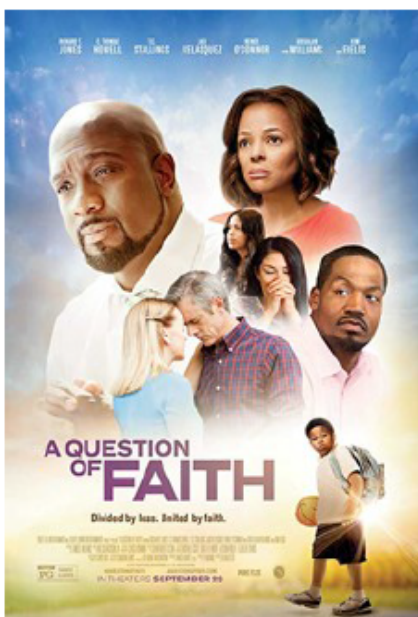
"A QUESTION OF FAITH" - Movie Review

RAINES VIKINGS HEAD COACH WINS BATTLE TO WALK AGAIN

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. -- Raines Vikings head coach Steven Bellamy's track team had a terrific season in 2017. The Vikings won a state and national championship. Off the track, Bellamy, however, was in a serious battle for his health.

Back in March, the 53-year-old was falling at track practice and he even fell out. Bellamy decided to go see his doctor on March 9. Bellamy said the doctor immediately noticed something was wrong with him and sent him to the emergency room. The doctors did an MRI and X-rays. The X-rays revealed Bellamy's C-3 and C-4 vertebra had collapsed. They were pressing up against his spine and nerves, which explains why he had been falling in practice.

The doctor then asked him to put down his crutch and walk, but he couldn't. Within days, Bellamy was on the operating table. His doctor told him if had he waited one more week, he would have been paralyzed for life. Bellamy said he didn't know how to handle the news. He broke down because it was his second bout with paralysis. But Bellamy fought through it and his boys never left his side.

Shortly after the emergency surgery, it was on to four weeks of grueling rehab. Bellamy said what made him fight through it was he had to get back to his team. Back in August, Bellamy agreed to try and walk for the first time in months in front of our cameras. It was a risky decision, but one that inspired his players.



For the first time since February, Bellamy walked without his crutch and unassisted. His players said it should teach them to never take

anything for granted and that with faith, all things are possible. Eight months since he had the emergency surgery, Bellamy is doing well. He said he can walk but still uses his crutch as a safety precaution.

HUNGER FIGHT 2017

There are times in our life where we wonder where our next meal will come from simply because we do not have enough food to eat or we have a choice to make from either paying a bill or buying groceries. Due to the vision of Sherri Porter she created an organization called Hunger Fight whose mission is to provide nutritious meals to children and families deemed food insecure and hungry in the surrounding First Coast community.

This organization has held “packing events” in different areas of the First Coast since its inception, and this year 12 members from Mount Bethel, led by our very own Sister Randall, have participated in the packing events for the last four years. This year’s event was held at the Prime Osborn Center on November 4th and the group managed in two hours to pack twenty boxes which held 42 bags of oatmeal per box which in turn will create 3,360 meals for families throughout the First Coast.

The fellowship among our fellow members along with other churches and businesses that come out to these types of events is what makes it fun and enjoyable. It is also humbling because you never know if this could be you one day in need of a meal like this to survive. Sister Randall and Brother Bell were asked by the Dean to give a brief summary as to why we are here assisting, and he wanted to relay to our Pastor a special thank you because he knows that he can always count on Mount Bethel to show up to this event. The group would like to give a special thank you to Sister Randall and Pastor Herring for bringing this to our attention each year and allowing us to experience for two hours the fun, enjoyment, and camaraderie of attending these packing events each year.

- **Statistics according to Hunger Fight**

- As of 11/06/2017 a total of 3,973,174 meals have been packed. This problem is not unique to any one region, state, city or town.
- 1 in 7 Americans don't have access to enough food as hunger has NO boundaries. Many people believe the problems associated with hunger are confined to small pockets of society, certain areas of the country, or certain neighborhoods, but the reality is much different. Hunger affects all social economic status.
- Right now, millions of Americans are struggling with hunger. These are often hard-working adults, children and seniors who simply cannot make ends meet and are forced to go without food for several meals, or even days.
- 41% of households served by food organizations have at least 1 working adult in the household
- 25% of adults interviewed during a Hunger study have attended college or a technical school
- More than 6.4 million children are living in food-insecure households
- The lack of adequate nutrition affects cognitive and behavioral development as well as physical growth, resulting in irritability, fatigue and difficulty concentrating
- Limited resources prevent 42 Million Americans from getting enough food
- 69% have to weigh between paying their electric bill or purchasing food
- 29% are Children (Duval County), 19% are elderly on a fixed budget, less than 9% are homeless

Issue 1 – Is Christmas in the Bible?

Issue 2 – December 25 Celebration

It is probably true that Jesus wasn't born on this date and that there was a pagan holiday celebrated probably around or on that date. However, *it appears from my research that "Christmas was established as a rival celebration to the pagan festival (Page 3).* What Christians did was to say, "Rather than celebrate in immorality the birth of Mithra, a false god who was never really born and who cannot save you, let us celebrate in joyful righteousness the birth of Jesus, the true God incarnate who is the Savior of the world." Many feasts given to Israel by God through Moses happen to parallel pagan agricultural festivals. What God did, in effect, was to establish feasts which would replace the pagan festivals...It would appear, then, that in principle there is nothing wrong with doing so in the case of Christmas..."

Issue 3 – What about Santa Claus

"There is no doubt that Santa Claus in its present form is a fairy tale or myth. However, there really was a Santa Claus. "...The name "Santa Claus" is an Anglicized form of the Dutch Sinter Klaas which in turn meant "Saint Nicholas." Nicholas was a Christian bishop in the fourth century about whom we know little for sure. He apparently attended the Council of Nicea in A.D. 325, and a very strong tradition suggests that he did show unusual kindness toward children. While the red-suited old man in a sled pulled by flying reindeer is a myth, the story of a children-loving old man who brought them gifts probably is not.....
